SOLEMNITY OF ST. JOSEPH, SPOUSE OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

THE GREATNESS OF ST. JOSEPH



St. Joseph's life as a carpenter in Nazareth is veiled in a profound silence, much like the enigmatic aura that surrounds him. Although the Gospels primarily recount his actions, these deeds, cloaked in quiet, hint at a profound contemplative nature. His daily interactions with the divine mystery dwelling within his home illuminate his inner being. This intimate connection with the divine mystery is highlighted by figures like St. Teresa of Jesus, who advocated for the renewed veneration of St. Joseph in Western Christianity. St. Teresa reminds us why St. Joseph is such a great intercessor. "To other saints, Our Lord seems to have given power to succour us in some special necessity," she wrote, "but to this glorious saint (I know by my experience), he has given the power to help us in all things. Our Lord would have us understand that, as he was subject to Joseph on earth, St. Joseph, bearing the title of his father and being his guardian, could command him, so now Our Lord in heaven grants all his petitions."

The depth of Joseph's interior life is the key to understanding his complete surrender to the mission of preparing for the Messiah's arrival in his household. From this rich inner world, he derived the strength and wisdom needed to make significant decisions, such as relinquishing his freedom to serve divine purposes and sacrificing his marital happiness for a virginal love beyond comprehension. His profound devotion to God enabled him to embrace the responsibilities and burdens of family life with unparalleled dedication. This profound submission to divine will, exemplified by Joseph's unwavering commitment to all that serves God, is a manifestation of religious devotion. It transcends mere duty, embodying a profound willingness to offer oneself entirely to the divine purpose. Joseph's life becomes a testament to

the virtue of religion, wherein devotion becomes synonymous with a readiness to surrender one's will to the service of God.

Compared to the numerous apparitions of the Blessed Virgin Mary, there are relatively few approved private revelations of St. Joseph. But there are some. One of those approved appearances of St. Joseph occurred in Cotignac, France, on June 7, 1660. On an extremely hot summer day, the humble shepherd, Gaspard Ricard, was parched with thirst. His flask of water was dry, and he was nowhere near a stream or body of water. Ricard sat down on the grass in agony. At that point, an older man suddenly appeared to him and said, "I am Joseph. Lift it, and you will drink." Joseph was pointing to a large boulder nearby, a rock that Ricard knew he couldn't lift by himself. Yet he tried, and somehow he was able to lift the boulder with ease. Underneath, it was a fresh spring of water. Overjoyed, Ricard looked up to thank the mysterious stranger, but he had already vanished. Ricard rushed to the village to tell everyone about the miraculous spring. Soon enough, the spring became associated with countless miracles, both physical and spiritual, and a shrine was built at the location. The spring of St. Joseph in Cotignac has been a pilgrimage site ever since.

Let's attune our hearts to the whispers of God, much like Joseph did in the quietude of his own soul. As we prepare ourselves to honor the feast of St. Joseph, let's embrace his remarkable example of wholeheartedly surrendering to the divine will with unwavering faith and trust, just as he did.

Psalm 8): "With Mary, guided by the dream, we generate peace by taking care of our common Home."

The **logo** of the Feast encloses a profound message through significant elements which offer us a beautiful symbology:

Mary, a prototype of taking care that embraces the world as our common home:



The different *faces of young people* from the five continents express our educational mission given to Johnny Bosco in his *dream* at nine years old;

The baobab, a sacred tree, symbolising life, is a powerful symbol of Africa that seems to unite heaven and earth and that provides people with nourishment and remedies to various ailments;

The colours of the *flag* of Mozambique represent the country's riches, its history, and its commitment to peace.

It is a charismatic tradition, a significant moment in the family of our Institute, a symbol of love and trustworthiness that we celebrate in an environment of prayer and joy, to express the gratitude and love that unite us to our Mother General as the centre of communion of our Institute. Let us offer her the gift of our prayers along with our creative fidelity to our life of consecration and mission.
