


BL. MARIA TRONCATTI

"THE LORD DOES NOT LEAVE US WITHOUT RAYS OF SUN AMONG THE CLOUDS AND STORMS THAT SOMETIMES SURROUND US." From the Pearls of Blessed Maria Troncatti.

Born in Cortegno Golgi, Italy, Blessed Maria Troncatti exemplifies faith, dedication, and missionary zeal. Feeling a strong calling from a young age, , driven by a deep commitment to serving the marginalised and vulnerable, she joined the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians

Her missionary work took her to the challenging terrains of Ecuador, where she dedicated herself to the indigenous people of the Amazon. Sr. Maria Troncatti wore many hats—nurse, surgeon, orthopedist, dentist, and anesthetist—often working under primitive conditions. Her respect for local culture fostered trust and meaningful connections within the indigenous communities.

Despite facing numerous hardships and dangers, her faith remained steadfast. She drew strength from prayer and devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Sr. Maria's efforts significantly improved healthcare, education, and quality of life for many. Her legacy of compassion and resilience continues to inspire those who seek to serve others selflessly.



On November 24, 2012, in Macas, Ecuador, the Venerable Servant of God, Sister Maria Troncatti, was declared Blessed. This recognition stemmed from a miraculous healing that occurred in the Diocese of Portoviejo, Province of Manab, Ecuador, involving Mrs. Josefa Yolanda Solórzano Pisco.

In April 2002, Mrs. Yolanda began suffering from what initially seemed like an ordinary flu. However, her condition worsened rapidly, leading to severe symptoms including headaches, abdominal pain, pallor, lack of appetite, and vomiting. Diagnosed with a severe form of malaria, her situation deteriorated to the point of coma. By May 8, 2002, her family prepared for her death, requesting her release from the hospital to spend her final moments at home.

On the same day, Salesian Father Edgar Iván Segarra Sánchez was called to administer the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. After performing this sacrament and presiding over Yolanda's marriage, as per her final wish, Father Segarra spoke of Sister Maria Troncatti and encouraged everyone to pray for Yolanda's recovery.

Miraculously, by the morning of May 10, 2002, Yolanda began to show signs of recovery. Her condition improved significantly; she regained consciousness, could eat, and her physiological functions normalized. Those who saw her later were astonished, believing she had been brought back to life through Sister Maria Troncatti's intercession. The Congregation for the Causes of Saints later recognised this as an inexplicable healing from severe malaria with multi-organ failure.

This miracle reminds us of God's intervention in our lives. As we seek divine assistance, let us trust in God's grace and ask Sister Maria Troncatti to intercede for us on our journey towards holiness.
